Native Flora of Millowl



As part of the Festival of Big Ideas, the Latrobe Valley Authority organised a co-presentation from two leaders and change-makers on putting biodiversity conservation and restoration back into the hands of the community. Gio Fitzpatrick, an award-winning naturalist and environmental activist and Jim Phillipson who is a multi-generational Gippslander and environmental philanthropist spoke about how we can collaborate to re-vison our bio-diverse future in Gippsland. Phillip Island Recreation Reserve - Carnival site – Master Plan

The Phillip Island Landcare Group will be partnering up with the Bass Coast Shire Council on this major project spanning over the next 3 years with the assistance from a grant we secured from SP Ausnet. Thank you SP Ausnet.

We will be assisting in the revegetation of the site (which is a very large area) with a couple of planting days in July this year. Then over the next few years committing to exclusion fencing and more revegetation works (planting days) – This is going to be a major community site with wonderful facilities for the broader community and PILG are going to be at the forefront of initial works in getting this project off the ground - how exciting to be hands on in the creation of this community asset.

Bendigo Landcare Forum

Sue Doyle and Carolyn attended the Victorian Landcare forum held in Bendigo in March. Apart from a fabulous opportunity to meet other landcare volunteers and professionals from across the state, there were insightful presentations including from the Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal, on how landcare is an effective and powerful platform for building community and placemaking as well as DJAARA (Traditional Owner organisation in the Loddon Mallee) on partnerships between First Nations groups and private landowners to heal country and support culture. We came away inspired by the importance of partnerships and learning from others with shared passions and tackling similar challenges.

One person whom we met (has the best name) Beth Ripper introduced herself as she is well aware of the sea spurge issue we have here on the island – she has information from CSIRO about removing this invasive weed and is open to anyone interested in contacting her for more information – bethripper@optusnet.com.au

Weed of the month



Gorse – this nasty piece of invasive weed is raising its pretty yellow flowers all over the Island – all help appreciated to curb the spread of this prickly pest. We have just messaged Fulton Hogan to advise them that we are monitoring their tardiness in their spraying of the gorse – We will update once we hear back – however, we may head up a task force soon to at least chop off the flowers prior to them setting seed.
